

HOW TO GET A BIBLE STUDY

In the course of making friendly conversations with a friend, relative, work associate, or new acquaintance, just CASUALLY...

ASK...

...Friendly questions about their family and occupation, leading to spiritual subjects:

“Do you have a home church? If not, did you ever go?”

“What is your experience with God?” or, “What are your personal beliefs?”

“Do you study the Bible much?” Or “Have you ever studied the Bible?”

“Have you ever gone through the Bible from start to finish?”

“Are you interested in studying/learning more about the Bible?”

Don't wait for an answer, move right on to...

SHARE...

...with them the beauty and simplicity of the course – (expectantly)

“I have found a great study going through the whole Bible”

“It covers the highlights of the Bible simply and clearly”

“It only takes about an hour (short)...”

“It only takes about one hour per week (long)...”

“It's free, and I won't ask you to join a church and you can stop at any time”

“Would you like to get together some to look at it?”

Now STOP and wait for an answer...

KEEP...

...your goal in mind to involve them in a Bible study as soon as possible:

“What is a good day for you? What time is convenient time to have it?”

“Is your house a good place? I'll arrange to take care of the children”

“Can I get your name, address, and phone number?”

- Give them an invitation or brochure

- Call them the same day of the study to confirm the meeting

Note: If they say “NO”, respond with...

“I understand, if you change your mind, I would be happy to teach you at a later time”
